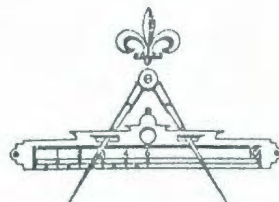

PUBLIC RELATIONS FOR MAP LIBRARIES

Joan Winearls was invited by the North York Public Library to speak at a gathering of about 50 people representing personnel of the main library and its branches on the 28th of April, 1971. Joan spoke on setting up a map collection in a public library and on maps and map libraries in general. Joan makes the excellent suggestion that this is a good way to publicize our profession and to spread the word around about what types of services our map libraries offer. So, if you're asked to speak to a group take up the challenge and try to find the time

to do a bit of public relations work for yourself and for all of us. If you get an invitation and can't take advantage of the opportunity yourself, don't let it slip by - find someone qualified to substitute for you. Why not even take the first step yourself and try to solicit some invitations to speak or invite some groups in for tours of your map library.

PUBLICATION OF NEWSLETTER

It is hoped that we will be able to establish a policy of issuing the Newsletter on a regular basis four times each year with special issues as needed. A standard numbering system will thus be established using a new volume number for each year, with individual issues each year numbered sequentially from number 1 to number 4 and special issues indicated as such and also numbered sequentially. In keeping with this policy, the volume number and issue number of the Newsletter of March 1971 should be changed to Volume IV, Number 1.
